## **Singapore Cooperation Programme**

Singapore has provided technical assistance to other developing countries since the 1960s. As a country whose only resource is its people, Singapore believes that human resource development is vital for economic and social progress. Singapore itself has benefited from training provided by other countries and international organisations.

In 1992, the Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) was established to bring together under one framework the various technical assistance programmes offered by Singapore. Through the SCP, the range and number of training programmes were increased to share Singapore's development experience with other developing countries. To date, Singapore has sponsored training courses and study visits for over 90,000 officials from more than 170 countries. The SCP is managed by the Technical Cooperation Directorate of the Singapore Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

## Singapore Judicial College (SJC)

The Singapore Judicial College is an entity dedicated to the training and development of Judges and Judicial Officers. Comprising a local and an international wing, the College is established under the auspices of the Supreme Court. The programmes that will be offered at the international wing, which may be driven by demand, will include a wide menu relevant to judicial work and useful interdisciplinary studies.

#### Course Objectives

This course will examine the various approaches to case management. At the end of the course, participants will be able to identify and apply the various strategies to manage case load according to the needs of their jurisdiction. Through this course, the international participants will benefit from the Singapore's experiences in case management with the international participants.

The application forms are to be submitted and should reach the **Ministry of Foreign Affairs**, **Singapore** through the National Focal Point and the Singapore Embassy in the nominating country not later than **Monday**, 23 February 2015.
