Objectives

The course aim to:

- To introduce the role of providers of health care under the framework of health security systems.
- To critically analyze behavioural characteristics and changes according to payment systems under the framework of health security systems.
- To develop necessary skills for providers of health care to excel under the framework of health security systems.

Qualifications

Applicant for this course should:

- Participants for this training course should have at least two years experiences in working as health care providers or purchasers of health care in health security systems.
- Participants should have basic knowledge on health insurance systems.
- Participants should be able to communicate (speaking and writing) in English and should have basic computing skills with computer software.

Course Contents

1. Course Outline

Components of formal and informal health service systems, patterns and types of services provided, incentives, provider behaviours, cost and efficiency of provision at primary, secondary and tertiary levels of care of public, private-not-for-profit and private for-profit providers, flows of revenues from provision of health care, accreditation system, health service management to achieve health system goals in short and long runs.

2. Practices

Participants will have opportunity to work on datasets from a number of health care providers to understand cost and efficiency of each type of provider.

3. Study Trips/Field Trips

Participants will visit a range of health care providers, public and private ownership to see real good practices.

4. Expected Results

- After completion of this course, the participants are able to
- provide theoretical framework of managing providers of health care in response to changes in payment mechanisms.
 - use analytical skills in decision-making and evaluation of health delivery systems.
