

About Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and subregional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries.

Annually, more than 100 MTCP programmes are offered by 79 MTCP training institutions, many of which are centres of excellence for training. Since its inception, MTCP has gained more than 30,600 participants from 141 countries which have benefited from the various programmes offered.
