About Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Development Countries (TUTC). The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and sub-regional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries. Annually, more than 80 MTCP programmes are offered by 80 MTCP Training Institution, many of which are centres of excellence for training. Since its inception, MTCP has gained more than 32,000 participants from 141 countries.

Objectives

- To share development experience with other countries
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries
- To promote South-south Cooperation (SSC)
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC)

- Long-term courses (Scholarships)
- Dispatch of Experts
- Technical Assistance

Course Fee

All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia. Accommodation, meals and lodging are provided by the Fire and Rescue Academy of Malaysia.

Fares

A return air ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided. However, some countries need to bear their own air fares (kindly refer to MTCP website for further details).

Visa, Vaccination, Medical & Dental Treatment

Successful participants are advised to arrange for their own visa and vaccination prior to their travel, in which the expense to obtain such requirement should be borne by them. Successful participants are required to submit a colored photocopy of the first page of the valid passport to the program organizer for immigration processing. Other information, travellers from certain countries in South America and Africa are required to produce a Yellow

Fever Vaccination Certificate at the entry point in Malaysia. For more information please refer to website <http://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country>. Candidates should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this programme. In the case of emergencies and in need of medical treatment, the medical expenses in a government hospital will be borne by the Government of Malaysia.

General Conditions of Award

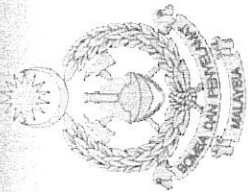
Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of the Fire and Rescue Academy of Malaysia. This scholarship cannot be held concurrently with any other scholarship awards. Participants shall follow the programme approved for them. Participants are NOT allowed to:

- Leave Malaysia during the Course, or
- To bring along their spouses or families throughout the duration of the courses.

Participants shall abide by the terms and conditions of the MTCP.

Application Dateline: 30 April 2017

Application should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available at https://mtcpcoms.kln.gov.my/mtcpcoms/online/list_course. The application must be completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs/Focal Points responsible for the MTCP Program in the applicant's country, then submitted through the applicant's government with a Note Verbale to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Malaysia via the nearest Malaysian High Commission/Embassy.



Fire Investigation Course 2017

Background

- Fire Investigation Course is designed to expose the participants with intensive learning on fire forensic by applying the scientific methodology.
- This two week course has been developed to expose the fire investigators in finding the cause of the fire.
- Participants will be introduced to the fire investigation tools and equipments during the practical exercise.

Objectives

At the end of the course participants will:

- Understand the basic methodology in finding the cause of the fire.
- Be able to identify the fire origin, source of ignition and fire cause of the structural and vehicle fire.

Training Outline/Methodologies

- Theoretical Lectures/Discussions
- Case Studies
- Role play
- Simulation exercises
- Practical exercise
- Technical Visits

Course Content

- Command & control on scene.
- Operational procedures at RTA incidents.
- Vehicle and machinery construction.
- Road accident rescue hazard
- Rescue / extrication equipment and techniques
- Pre-medical and casualty care.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- Participants will be monitored and evaluated through the classroom presentations and field exercises.
- At the end of every session, participants are required to give the feedback.
- After returning to the home countries, participants are expected to share the experience and make a presentation to colleagues as well as senior management of the same offices.
- Participants are required to send e-mail to Fire and Rescue Academy, Malaysia (FRAM) regarding their performance and achievement after attending the course i.e. rank promotion etc.

Targeted Participants

- Fire and rescue officers.
- Fire Investigators

Expected Outcome

- Participants will enhance their knowledge, experience and self-confidence in finding the fire origin, the source of ignition and the cause of the fire.
