

ABOUT THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

MTCP was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries. The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and sub-regional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries. Annually, more than 80 MTCP programmes are offered by 80 MTCP training institutions/agencies, many of which are centre of excellence for training. Since its inception, more than 32,000 participants from 143 countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

OBJECTIVES OF MTCP

- To share development experience with other countries
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC)

ABOUT ENVIRONMENT INSTITUTE OF MALAYSIA (EIMAS)

The Environment Institute of Malaysia (EIMAS) was established in 2001. It is located within the campus of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Bangi, Selangor. It is the training institute of the Department of Environment Malaysia (DOE), under the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment. Training programmes conducted by EIMAS for DOE personnel focus on diverse areas pertaining to

environmental management and pollution control such as water quality management; air quality management; environmental legislation and enforcement; scheduled waste management; and environmental impact assessment. Besides DOE personnel, EIMAS also organizes Certification Programmes for industries.

Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the applicant's:

- Copy of Passport
- Passport sized coloured photo (3.5cm x 5cm)
- Medical Report

All application must be endorsed by participating countries' Ministry of Foreign Affairs/Focal Point with a Note Verbale are completed forms must forwarded to the relevant Malaysia Embassies or Mission. The Application form should also be e-mailed to mtcp-eimas@doe.gov.my.

Only successful applicants will be notified.

TARGET PARTICIPANTS

This Course is relevant for officials from the Environmental Protection Agency of ASEAN member countries and Asia Pacific Countries, between 25 – 45 years of age.

Education and Working Experience

Applicants must:

- i. possess at least a Diploma in the field of sciences or engineering and proficient in English.
- ii. have at least 1 year practical experience in environmental management and pollution control

FELLOWSHIP / SCHOLARSHIP

Terms and conditions of scholarship / fellowship awards under the MTCP at EIMAS include:

Food and Lodging

Food and lodging will be provided for the duration of the course. Participants are not allowed to bring any family members during the course.

Air Fares

A Return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants (Except for countries with GDP per capita exceeding USD5000). Please refer to the MTCP website for further details.

Course Fees

All course fees are borne by the Malaysian Government.

Medical and Dental Treatment

Candidates should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this program. During participants' stay in Malaysia, all medical and dental expenses in government hospital / clinic are at the cost of the Malaysian Government. Dental treatment however is restricted to extraction and filling only which must be carried out in government hospitals / clinics only.

Visa and Vaccination

All participants are required to enter Malaysia with Visa with Reference (VDR). Once the approval is obtained, the training institutions should send a copy of letter of approval to the participants. Subsequently, with the copy of the approval, the participants may get the VDR from the nearest Malaysian Missions. Wherever applicable, participants are advised to arrange for vaccination on their own prior to travel to Malaysia.

Expenditures on all visa-related fees, airport tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc borne by the recipients. This also applies for vaccination before travel to Malaysia.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF AWARD

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of EIMAS.

The award may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the award, failure to make satisfactory progress or as deemed necessary by the Malaysian training institution.

Participants are not allowed to participate in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not take up paid employment during the tenure of their scholarship or serve on the staff of their Official Representatives in Malaysia.

Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the course. Participants are NOT allowed to plan for their own vacation or go to other destinations during the course duration without prior approval from the training institute. Participants will be required to return to their own countries upon completion of the course or at the end of the tenure of the scholarship, whichever is earlier.
