

Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was established in 1980 aiming at providing technical assistance to participating developing countries. The Programme consolidates various forms of technical cooperation in areas where Malaysia has the experience and the expertise.

Annually, more than 80 MTCP programmes are offered by 80 MTCP Training Institution, many of which are centres of excellence for training. Since its inception, MTCP has gained more than 32,000 participants from 143 recipient developing countries.

Objectives of MTCP:

- To share development experience with other countries;
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC);
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC).

Type of Assistance:

- Short-term specialized courses;
- Long-term courses (Scholarships);
- Technical Assistance; and
- Dispatch of Experts.

Malaysia Anti-Corruption Academy (MACA)

MACA, the first of its kind in the Asia-Pacific region acts as a principal anti-corruption training center was established in 1 December 2005. It is also as a regional hub for anti-corruption capacity and capability building to fight corruption by promoting best practices in investigation, prevention and venturing in new areas such as forensic accounting and forensic engineering.

Many international institutions and organizations have agreed to cooperate with Malaysia in developing anti-corruption programmes including conducting the courses, trainings, seminars and workshops annually that would cater for the Asia Pacific region. This is made possible through the bilateral and multilateral networking with other enforcement agencies in the region such as the ICAC Hong Kong, FBI, BMR Brunei Darussalam, KICAC (Republic of Korea), CPIB Singapore, NACC Thailand and many others.

The establishment of this academy reflects the seriousness and commitment of the Malaysian government to combat corruption and also as part of its contribution to the international community in the global fight against corruption.

EXECUTIVE CERTIFICATE FOR STRATEGIC MANAGEMENT OF ANTI-CORRUPTION PROGRAM

Course Overview and Objectives

To enhance the professional competencies of the participants in managing the fight against corruption. Specifically, the course aims to enable the participants to:

- Understand the causes and effects of corruption and its negative consequences on the well being of the nation and citizenry;
- Strengthen technical know-how and skills in corruption prevention, detection, investigation, prosecution and community education; and
- Develop an effective anti-corruption strategy, drawing lessons from best (and worst) practices in the region.

Course Content

- Perspectives and concepts on corruption;
- Comparative studies of anti-corruption structures, strategies and programs of Malaysia Development Members Countries and selected democracies;
- Legal Framework for fighting corruption;
- Detection, investigation and prosecution of corrupt practices;
- Prevention of corruption; and
- Public education, community relation and partnership building.

Target Participant

The target participants to the course are middle level management government officials engaged in anti-corruption work such as:

- Anti-Corruption Authorities
- Audit Commission
- Civil Service Commission

Participants must meet the following criteria:

- Proficiency in English language;
- Computer literate;
- Preferably university degree holder or equivalent;
- Participants should be able to attend all the sessions of the course. Successful completion of the course will also require participants to actively participate in the discussions, workshops, case studies, and group work;
- Age between 26-50 years; and
- Have not participated in any training programme under MTCP [if applicable].

Methodology

- Lecture
- Panel Discussion
- Case Study
- Group Work/Assignment
- Group Presentation

Fellowship / Scholarship

The term and conditions of scholarship / fellowship awards under MTCP include :

- **Fares** : A return air ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided (except for countries with GDP per capita exceeding USD 5,000).
- **Accommodation** : Full board and accommodation will be provided for the duration of the training.
- **Course Fees** : All courses fees will be borne by the Malaysian Government under the MTCP.
- **Medical & Dental Treatment** : Candidates should be certified medically fit to participate under this programme.

- **Visa & Vaccination** : Training Institutions will apply for VDR and upon approval, a copy will be forwarded to the participants who will subsequently need to collect their respective VDR from the nearest Malaysian mission. Participant must bear all expenses on medical check-up, vaccinations (whenever applicable) and all visa-related fees, airport-tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc.

- **General Condition Awards** : Participants shall conduct themselves at all time in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the rules and regulation on Training Institution.

The award may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory progress.

****Participants are not allowed to bring along their spouse for the duration of the course.**
