

AIR FARE

An economy-class return air ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur is provided for participants and issued upon confirmation of acceptance.

VISA AND VACCINATIONS

Course participants must comply with the Visa with Reference (VWR) application procedure to enter Malaysia. They must possess a valid passport or other internationally recognised travel document and visa, if necessary, valid for at least 6 months beyond the period of stay in Malaysia.

Successful participants are required to submit a coloured photocopy of the first page of their passports, a current passport-size coloured photograph, and acceptance letter to MIMA as the organiser. MIMA will apply for VWR at the Department of Immigration, Malaysia for immigration processing besides obtaining specific VWR Approval Letter for the participants.

A copy of the VMR Approval Letter will be forwarded to the successful participants upon approval. VMR collection should be made at the nearest Malaysian Embassy or High Commission. Participants with the VMR Approval Letter must obtain a VMR stamp at the specific Malaysia Mission before entering Malaysia.

NOTE: Successful participants must arrange for their own visa and vaccination prior to travel and all costs including those related to medical check-ups and vaccinations should be BORNE BY PARTICIPANTS

Participants from yellow fever endemic areas which include diplomatic and official passport holders must take a mandatory vaccination for yellow fever at least 10 days prior to travel to Malaysia. They are required to show the Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate at the entry point in Malaysia.

INCOMPLETE OR UNENDORSED FORMS WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.

ABOUT MTCP

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) for the Asia Pacific Region in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi to underscore Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, specifically Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). Malaysia shares its development experiences and expertise with numerous developing countries through the MTCP in line with the spirit of South-South Cooperation. The MTCP highlights the development of human resources through the provision of training in various key areas based on the belief that the development of a country depends significantly on the quality of its human resources. Since its inception, more than 32,800 participants from 143 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under MTCP.

OBJECTIVES OF MTCP

- To share development experiences with other countries
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC)
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC)

COURSE BACKGROUND

MIMA has been conducting MTCP training courses since 2010 in the area of ports and shipping, international trading, maritime law, principles of the shipping and trading industry, port development and administration, shipping traffic management, and maritime non-traditional security.

The 2018 MTCP International Training Course on Maritime Supply Chain Governance, Regulations and Management will outline the principles of the maritime supply chain and industrial practicability of the maritime industry. By the end of the training course, participants will have enhanced competency in the mentioned areas besides acquiring insights on the growing complexity and best practices in the maritime supply chain.

COURSE CONTENT

The 7-day course includes an Overview of the Maritime Supply Chain, Malaysian Port Sector, Malaysian Shipping Sector, Malaysian Ports, Regional Ports, Public Private Partnerships, Port Privatisation, Port Regulation, Management and Operations, Domestic and International Ship Registry, National Port Strategy, Malaysian Logistics Master Plan, Ship Building Ship Repair Target 2020, Evolution of Vessels. Participants will make Country Presentations at the end of the course.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Enhance understanding of the maritime supply chain and industry
- Govern, regulate, and manage industries involved in the maritime supply chain
- Share best practices of the respective countries in the governance, regulations, and management of maritime industry
- Understand the growing complexity of the maritime industry

COURSE METHODOLOGY

The course will include a combination of the following:

- Lectures
- Workshops and tutorials
- Case studies

- Group discussions and presentations
- Technical site visits
- Evaluation

Case studies and group works will be applied as the methodology for the participants to identify, analyse and interpret situations as a form of experimental learning, besides sharing and benefiting from experiences among each other. Participants are required to prepare Country Papers and present Country Reports on the Maritime Supply Chain Governance, Regulations, and Management of their respective countries.

ELIGIBILITY

The course is primarily intended for government officials directly involved in the governance, regulation, and management of the maritime industry. Commercial managers serving in the industry are also eligible. Participants should be nominated by the respective governments based on the following:

- Senior and middle level officials or managers from maritime industry or related agency
- Possess a good command of both written and spoken English
- Aged 26-50 years

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The training course will be fully conducted in English.

COURSE DURATION

The training course will be from 5 – 11 August 2018 inclusive of arrival and departure dates.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation with breakfast will be provided for the duration of the training by the organiser. The participants are required to check-in on 5 August and check-out on 11 August 2018. No additional nights will be considered.
