Applicants will be notified of their acceptance to the course either through the Malaysian government representative or INTAN.

MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) for Asia Pacific Region in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). In line with the spirit of South-South Cooperation, Malaysia - through the MTCP - shares its development experiences and expertise with other developing countries. Based on the belief that the development of a country depends on the quality of its human resources, the MTCP focuses on human resource training in areas essential for a country's development.

Since its inception in 1980, more than 32,800 participants from 143 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION (INTAN)

The National Institute of Public Administration (INTAN) is the training arm of the Public Service Department, the central human resource development agency of the Malaysian government. INTAN provides quality training for all categories of civil servants from both federal and state levels.

It aims at increasing the level of knowledge and skills of participants and in enhancing positive attitudes towards upgrading their ability to plan, administer, manage, and evaluate national development programmes. This is in line with its mission of developing a competent public sector workforce through quality learning.

The training offered by INTAN includes project management, language enhancement, economic planning & management, National Blue Ocean Shift (NBOS), and learning & development.

- NBOS initiatives in Malaysia - 'Transforming Lives-Empowering Citizens' - delivering high impact, low cost, and rapid execution programmes and services.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Government officials aged 26-50 years at managerial level directly involved in the management of ICT development and technical strategy.
- Certified medically fit both physically and mentally.
- Non-military personnel.
- Good command of spoken and written English.
- Never participated in any MTCP courses.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Application

Successful applicants will be provided:

- A return flight ticket from the capital city of the MTCP recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants. Tickets will be issued upon confirmation of acceptance.
- Full board accommodation (twin sharing) throughout the duration of the training.
- Meals and allowance.

Visa and Vaccination

- It is mandatory for participants to adhere to the Visa With Reference (VWR) application procedure.
- Successful applicants are required to submit a coloured photocopy of the first page of their valid passport for immigration processing.
- Successful applicants are advised to make their own visa and vaccination arrangements prior to travel. Related expenses are to be borne by participants.
- Participants from yellow fever-endemic areas including diplomatic and official passport holders are required to take a mandatory vaccination for yellow fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure for Malaysia and to produce a Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate at the entry point in Malaysia.
- **INTAN reserves the right to return participants found to be medically unfit during the course of the programme to their respective countries.**
