About Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to the South-South Cooperation, in particular, the Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasizes on the development of human resources through the provision of trainings in various areas which are essential for a country's development such as agriculture, economy, finance, public management and administration. Science & technology and ICT, health diplomacy, safety and security including cyber security, cultural diplomacy, social development, environtment related to SDG2030, education, industrial and technical training. Annually, Malaysia offered more than 60 tehcnical and capacity building programme under the MTCP, which have benefited more than 35,500 participants from 144 countries.

MTCP Objectives

- To share development experience with other countries:
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries.

About National Audit Academy (NAA)

The National Audit Academy was established as a development project of the National Audit Department under the Eight Malaysia Plan. The construction was completed on 26 July 2005 and inaugurated in November 2005. Situated at Bandar Enstek, Negeri Sembilan.
